



MPG 1:1 ABA Educational Program

A full-day, individualized program whose needs may not be met in traditional school settings.

What Is MPG's AEPP?

Our **Alternative Education Placement Program (AEPP)** is a full-day, clinic-based program designed for students ages 5 to 21 with autism or other significant disabilities whose needs cannot be met in traditional school settings. Every student receives continuous 1:1 Applied Behavior Analysis delivered by master's-level Behavior Interventionists (BIs), with daily hands-on supervision from one of the largest teams of Board Certified Behavior Analysts (BCBAs) in New York City. Academic and functional skill support aligned with each student's IEP goals. Designed to minimize coordination gaps and support integrated care



How We Practice

- ✓ **Assent-based:** We involve students in their own learning and continuously monitor whether they are engaged and comfortable.
- ✓ **Function-focused:** We ask why before we intervene. No punishment-based procedures.
- ✓ **Data-driven:** Every student's program is built from individualized assessment and reviewed continuously. BCBAs analyze data daily and adjust based on ongoing data.
- ✓ **Co-regulation first:** Our BIs are highly trained, helping students move through difficult moments and build the relational foundation that makes learning possible.

How to Get Started

- 1. Initial Consultation:** Call or email us to discuss your child's history and current challenges.
- 2. Record Review & Clinical Screening:** We review IEPs, evaluations, and meet with your child to assess fit.
- 3. Program Design:** We build an individualized proposal and work with your family and legal team
- 4. Enrollment:** Rolling admission. Students can begin at any point in the year.

AEPP is a clinical program and not an accredited school. Educational and skill-based support is provided in coordination with each student's IEP and educational team.

How Our Program Shines

Our AEPP is designed for students who require consistent, individualized support throughout the entire day, not just during isolated therapy hours. Every student receives **full-day, continuous 1:1 ABA delivered primarily by master's-level clinicians, with BCBAs providing supervision** and hands-on involvement in daily programming.

Clinicians implement evidence-based teaching strategies across instruction, transitions, social interaction, self-help skills, and behavior regulation, ensuring high-caliber clinical supervision, with programs reviewed regularly and adjusted based on ongoing data. AEPP is supported by **one of the largest teams of BCBAs in New York City.**

Program at a Glance

Is This Program Right for Your Child?

- Have not made meaningful progress in prior public or private school placements
- Spend significant portions of the school day dysregulated or unable to access instruction
- Are currently on home instruction or at risk of being placed there
- Have cycled through multiple placements without finding an environment that fits
